THE GENERAL MARKET IS DISPLAYING SIGNS OF LINGERING, EVEN IF SOME AREAS ARE ESPECIALLY ACTIVE AND ENTERPRISING. SOME ASIAN COUNTRIES, PARTICULARLY TURKMENISTAN AND UZBEKISTAN, WHICH FOR YEARS HAVE BEEN BIG PRODUCERS OF COTTON, ARE SHOWING GREAT INTEREST IN NEW INVESTMENTS CREATING A NEW MARKET FOR SPINNING AND WEAVING EQUIPMENT.

A confirmation of this trend was the successful trade show Caitme 2008 in Tashkent, during which Marzoli received a remarkable number of new contacts and requests for quotation. In order to guarantee an effective and prompt pre and after-sale service in the Uzbek market we have signed a cooperation agreement with the company Belting Rezina srl, which is also a spare parts producer. Thanks to their existing structure with local sales and service personnel, this cooperation will allow us to extend our service to the entire

Central Asian territories. After a slowdown period, the Indian market is now recovering, thereby confirming its interest in textile investments, especially for the production of high quality yarns. In this regards, our combing equipment is capable of satisfying the needs of the most demanding clients thanks to the technical evolution of the new comb CM600N, which is receiving much interest and acceptance. Marzoli has expanded its service in the Indian market that can now count on an efficient structure

with offices in the north in New Delhi and Mumbai and in the south in Madras and Coimbatore, where eight sales managers and nine service technicians trained at the Italian Marzoli headquarters are operational to serve the entire Indian territories. ► Technical section: special processes.

The growing need to employ products that are 100% natural in the production of single-use fabrics for cosmetic, health, and medical use (for example: tampons, disks, rags, sanitary pads) has set in motion the development of new technologies that have been applied to the normal processes of opening and carding to allow Marzoli to achieve ultra modern and technologically advanced installations. In fact, in the last few years Marzoli cooperated directly with its clients to further improve its production systems to reach world-class status for this type of equipment. Technically we are talking about the following technologies:

OPENING

- New systems of soft opening.
- Beater with variable rotation speed in order to adjust to the proper fiber flow.
- Feeding material with extremely low weigh.
- Conveyor systems made of advanced materials.
- High raw materials storage capacity on the various process of knock.

CARDING

- New systems of web or slivers formation designed with transversal belts are the ideal solution for working with recycled fibers or extremely short fibers.
- Cards without coiler or web detaching device that allow

the production of web with adequate weight for all needs.

- Direct suction of the web from the doffer or web detaching device to enable the next process of the flake fiber.

▶ CM600N Comber

The new comber offers many technical advantages as described in our online brochure, but, more remarkably, it allows production cost reductions such as:

- Investment cost (greater production per machine).
- Cost of raw materials (better fiber selection with less waste accomplished with equal yarn quality).
- Operational cost (reduction of personnel).
- Energy cost (thanks to the optimization of the machine's kinematics and dynamics).



▶ MPTN Spinning Frame

In order to satisfy the demands of the market, Marzoli produces two different classes of spinning frames:

- MP1N with a drive belt.
- MPTN with tangential drive.

Both spinning frames have three different geometries that allow the optimization of working speed with a resulting decrease in energy consumption. Marzoli offers a completely integrated system slab without requiring additional equipment. Additionally, Marzoli spinning frames are prearranged for the installation of technologically tested and universally recognized compact spinning systems. At the trade show the Marzoli spinning frame will feature the ROCOS system.

▶ FTSDN Roving Frame

The Marzoli roving frame, with or without the doffing system, is universally recognized to be a machine of unmatched productivity, efficiency, and roving quality.

Rieter has been purchasing Marzoli roving frames for about twenty years for their plants.

In 2007 Marzoli tested, approved, and put into production a roving frame equipped with optional automatic doffing, 6"x16" flyer, with 192 spindles and a total machine length of 24 meters (about 79 feet). Of all the worldwide textile equipment

producers, Marzoli is the only company that has designed and tested a roving frame with such features. The new solution allows to:

- Improve the spinning plant's H.O.K. index.
- Reduce the space requirements.
- Reduce the annual spare parts cost.
- Simplify the automatic transport system and consequently favor automation in the spinning plant.

All these new solutions have been patented.
